Academic Panel Promising Projects in the Pipeline

Dr. Bob Hutkins, Professor of Food Science & Technology, University of Nebraska – Lincoln

Professor Bob Hutkins is the Khem Shahani Professor of Food Microbiology in the Food Science and Technology Department at the University of

Nebraska-Lincoln. The Hutkins Lab studies bacteria important in human health and in fermented foods. His group is particularly interested in: (1) identifying factors affecting persistence of probiotic bacteria in the gastrointestinal tract; and (2) how combinations of pro- and prebiotics (synbiotics) can improve human health.

Kevin Kimle, Director - Agricultural Entrepreneurship
Initiative, Iowa State University

Kevin currently serves as the Rastetter
Chair of Agricultural Entrepreneurship at Iowa
State University, Director of the Agricultural

Entrepreneurship Initiative, and Teaching Professor in the Department of Economics. He is also co-founder and co-director of the Ag Startup Engine, an investment fund and mentoring platform based in the Iowa State University Research Park.
