He received his Ph.D. in Agricultural Economics from the University of California, Davis, his M.S. in Agricultural and Resource Economics from the University of Maryland and a Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology from George Washington University.



Hans Kabat, President, Cargill Protein North America

Hans Kabat is the president of Cargill's North American protein business, which operates in the U.S. and Canada with more than 28,000 employees. Hans began his career with Cargill in 2001 and has over two decades of global experience managing complex protein supply chains in North America, Asia and Europe. He is focused on driving operational excellence across Cargill's protein portfolio, growing domestic and global market share and delivering innovative products to customers and consumers. Hans holds a bachelor's degree from the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University and a Ph.D. in political economy from the University of Minnesota.



Rod Snyder, Senior Advisor for Agriculture, Environmental Protection Agency

Rod Snyder was appointed Senior Advisor for Agriculture to the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in October 2021. He is recognized for his nearly two decades of leadership at the intersection of agricultural and environmental policy. From 2014-2021, Rod served as president of Field to Market: The Alliance for Sustainable Agriculture, which is the largest multi-stakeholder initiative working to advance the sustainability of commodity crop farming in the United States. Prior to his time at Field to Market, Rod held positions as Public Policy Director for the National Corn Growers Association and Government Affairs Leader for CropLife America.



Ken Seitz, President & CEO, Nutrien

Ken Seitz is President and Chief Executive Officer for Nutrien. He brings over 25 years of global management experience working across more than 60 countries, with a deep background in the agriculture and mining sectors. Ken joined Nutrien in October 2019, as Executive Vice President and CEO Potash, leading the world's largest potash producer with over 20 million tonnes of potash capacity at its six lower-cost potash mines in Saskatchewan. Before joining Nutrien, he was the President and CEO of Canpotex, one of the world's largest suppliers of Potash, where he was appointed to the role in 2015. Ken has a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture, a Bachelor of Engineering and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Saskatchewan.



Seth Meyer, Chief Economist, USDA

Seth Meyer, Ph.D., was appointed USDA's Chief Economist in January of 2021, returning to USDA after two years. Prior to his return, Meyer was a Research Professor and the Associate Director for the Food and Agricultural Policy Research Institute (FAPRI) at the University of Missouri. FAPRI is well known for is agricultural policy and market analysis, being called on by Congress and the USDA for its insight into commodity production, price, farm income and trade impacts from various agricultural policies including Farm Bill proposals, trade agreements and disruptions and crop insurance.
